The Character of The One Who Has Been Saved of God 2:8-10

I. What Salvation Actually Is 2:8

For it is by free grace (God’s unmerited favor) that you are saved (delivered from judgment and made partakers of Christ’s salvation) through [your] faith. And this [salvation] is not of yourselves [of your own doing, it came not through your own striving], but it is the gift of God; (Amplified Bible)

“For by [the] grace you have been saved through faith . . .”

“security of the believer could not have been expressed in stronger terms”

1) We only stand on the ground of grace in salvation cf. 2:5-7

ALL BY GRACE the grace that has the first place

2) We only have with the hand of Him in salvation ALL OF GOD

3) We only walk on the footing of faith in salvation ALL IN HIM

“[salvation] has been effected by grace & apprehended through faith.”

CONCLUSION “Lord, save me!” cf. Matthew 14:28-32

- Having the Lord Jesus most in our thinking about our salvation

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
